The importance of attendance:

- You must be in school every day and on time to maximise your learning.
- Nether Green children love coming to school and we are proud of our attendance.
- If your child is unwell, please call the office to let them know. Please do not send an email to report an absence as it may not be seen until later in the day.
- If your child has had a difficult weekend/night/start to the day you can let the office know and ask to speak to a member of staff from the inclusion team

What to do on the first day

- Tuesday 5th September
- From 8.40 a.m. please bring your child into school with all their belongings
- Use the entrance at the side of school where the main entrance is (bottom gate)
- 8.50 bell time, register
- 3.35 p.m. Please go onto the large playground to collect -Children will come out from dining room stairs.



Day 2

Start of the day -Parents say goodbye in car park space - children go up steps and into school on their own.

Gate opens at 8.40 a.m. to 8.50 am



- Staff on duty on the gates and teachers will greet their class as they arrive.
- If late please go to main entrance and let the office staff know.
- 3.35 p.m. Please go onto the large playground to collect -Children will come out from dining room stairs with their teacher.

What do you need?

- Water bottle
- Book bag
- Dress code
- School Sweat shirt/ t-shirt (optional)



Useful Information

- Your child's meal pattern is requested in advance not each morning. If you wish to change your child's meal pattern you must inform the office - not the classroom staff.
- School Meals must be paid for in advance on ParentPay (online payment system) or in cash NOT cheque.
- ParentPay
- Online Payment system used to make payments for meals, trips and events. You will have received a personalised letter about this in your welcome pack. Please set this up if you can.
- PE T Shirts You must have the correct PE kit. PE T Shirts can be purchased at the school office for £5 CASH ONLY. PLEASE PUT YOUR CHILD'S NAME ON IT.
- School Hoodies optional
- Administering Medication

-We are not allowed to administer any medication to a pupil in school unless it is prescribed by a doctor.

-If your child needs regular medication it is your responsibility to make sure this is maintained. ie in date and that you have completed a form

Useful Information

Free School Meals

-If you think you may be eligible to receive Free School Meals, please collect a letter from the school office.

-Likewise, if you think your child may qualify for Pupil Premium, please speak to someone in the office.

Pupil Premium is for :-

-pupils who are recorded as eligible for free school meals, or have been recorded as eligible in the past 6 years, including eligible children of families who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)

-children looked after by local authorities, referred to as looked-after children

-children previously looked after by a local authority or other state care, referred to as previously looked-after children
