## Project theme for this half term

## Project question How did life change for people from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?

We will learn about how people lived during this time in history and the artefacts they left behind. We explore Stone Age sites around the country and make models of Stone Age houses. This project also includes the chance to create art influenced by Stone Age people. We will also be visiting Creswell Crags for a living history day.

Alongside our History project, our Science project is about rocks and soils (including fossils). We learn about different types of rocks, the composition of soil and how fossils are formed.

## Life skills

In our Life Skills work this half term, we will be focusing on the key question, "What makes a family?"

Within this key question, we will explore:

- Do families always stay the same?
- Are all families like mine?
- When should I say no?
- Who owns my horiv? I do!

## English

We will be giving the children lots of opportunities to write a range of genres over the year. Much of our writing is linked to our projects as this gives the children a context for their writing and helps them to produce their best.

This half term we will be focusing on: Traditional tales, poetry and adventure stories.

The children will have a dedicated reading lesson on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9:10am - 9:30am. These sessions give the children the opportunity to fully develop a range of reading skills.

As a class we will read Stone Age Tales by Terry Deary

## Maths

In our daily maths lessons this term we will be covering the following topics:

- Place Value
- Place Value with mental calculations
- Addition written calculations
- Subtraction written calculations

Subtraction written calculations

We will make use of concrete resources to aid children's learning of these topics. We will focus on using lots of key vocabulary. For example, our place value topic will focus on the children's understanding of knowing the value of each digit in a number, (hundreds, tens and ones).

We will continue to embed the children's times tables in preparation for the Multiplication check in Y4.

Key vocabulary: place value, ones, tens, hundreds, add, total, sum, subtract, minus, take-away.

## P.E.

- Children have two weekly P.E. lessons.
- One will take place in the sports hall and the other will take place outside on one of the playgrounds.
- P.E. kit all children are expected to get changed for P.E. lessons. The children are required to wear black shorts/ leggings/ tracksuit bottoms and a NGJST shirt (these can be bought at the school office). In cooler weather, the children may also wear a sweatshirt to keep warm during their outdoor P.E. lesson. Children are also expected to wear suitable footwear for P.E. (trainers) and must wear a change of footwear for lessons in the sports hall.
- All jewellery must be removed and long hair must be tied back.

## Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and will be expected to be completed by the following Wednesday. Details about the homework task will be stuck in each child's homework book. Homework will (mostly) be completed in the homework book. There will be a dedicated time in class for children to share their homework on a Thursday.

- Reading
- Times Tables (TT Rock Stars)
- Consolidating learning in the classroom for all subjects
- Encouraging children to be independent and lead their learning at home

# Integrated Resource

- Our school is in the very fortunate position to have an Integrated Resource (IR) for 16 children with complex and significant special educational needs. All children placed have an EHCP and parents/ carers apply for a place through a separate process to mainstream children.
- These children sometimes join a class within their chronological age group for some lessons per week in order to help develop social and communication skills and to develop relationships.
- We embrace the personalities and strengths of these children and actively encourage our mainstream children to be good role models, patient, caring and empathetic members of our school.
