## Project theme for this half term

Project guestion What is the United Kingdom and where do I fit in?

This term we have a Geography project focusing on where the United Kingdom is and where we fit in. We will be learning about the difference between continents, countries and counties. We will be looking at local geography as well as the physical features that make up the United Kingdom, like coasts and mountains.

#### Science project: How do forces affect the world around us?

We will learn about magnetism and friction and will be taking part in some interesting investigations as well as ensuring there are lots of cross-curricular links, including opportunities to enjoy art and music. Some exciting lessons will include; testing magnetic objects and using different materials to test friction.

# Life skills

Our life skills this half-term focuses on the key question, 'What makes a family?' and 'How can we keep our friendships healthy?' Within this key question, we will explore:

- When should I say no?
- Who owns my body? I do!
- What makes a good friend?

## **Enalish**

We will be giving the children lots of opportunities to write a range of genres over the year. We base much of our writing around our projects as this gives the children a context for their writing and help them to produce their best. Include:

- Reading
- The children will have a dedicated reading lesson each morning from 9:10am - 9:30am. These sessions give the children the opportunity to fully develop a range of reading skills.

### **Maths**

In our daily maths lessons this term, we will be covering the following topics:

- Inverse operations (+ and -)
- Mental methods of multiplication and division
- Written methods of multiplication and division

We will make use of concrete resources to aid children's learning of these topics. We will focus on using lots of key vocabulary such as arrays, equal, multiples, sharing, grouping. commutative, partition, divide.

We will continue to embed the children's times tables in preparation for the Multiplication check in Y4.
