#### **School Council**

The School Council has been focussing on the question: How to improve our school community?

This question is linked with our Life skills Curriculum. The children have taken this question back to their classes and had a discussion amongst their peers.

Some of the suggestions have supported the development of the library area, as well as making sure there is a quiet area for children to access during playtimes.

The School Council has also been looking at our school values and identity to support the school in developing a new school logo. At our last school council meeting we spent some time researching logos of other junior schools in Sheffield and generated ideas through a vision board.

Our next project will be identifying how we can raise money for Sport Relief as a school. The school councillors will be publicising the event during an assembly and thinking of money raising ideas to support the charity.



### Music of the Half-Term

### Reggae

Listening to music is fundamental to musical understanding. By learning to listen critically, our children will not only expand their musical horizons but also gain a deeper understanding of how music is constructed and the impact it can have on the listener. Listening to a broad range of music also helps develop other areas of musical activity, including composing and performing.

Therefore, each half term we focus on a 'music of the half term' which is explored through assemblies and further listening opportunities. This half term, we will be focussing on Reggae music, in particular the piece *Three Little Birds* by Bob Marley.



### Language of the Half Term

Each term we select a different language for the pupils to learn greetings and basic phrases. We choose languages which represent our school community. At Nether Green, we feel it is important to give bilingual children the chance to demonstrate

their language skills as well as having the opportunity to share details of their family's country and culture. Language of the Half-term also allows monolingual English speakers to encounter and learn to speak a variety of languages.

All teachers embrace the selected language of the half-term and actively encourage the children to say good morning, good afternoon and respond to simple yes/no questions in the given language.

#### Spring 1 - Language of the Term - Somali

The chosen language for this half-term is Somali. There are about 25 million people in the world who can speak Somali. Somali is one of the languages spoken by some of our children at Nether Green Junior School.

### **Safeguarding Top Tip**

Promoting good mental health and wellbeing is very important for children. Maintaining a routine can help with this.

A steady routine can help provide stability in a child's life, which can give children and young people a sense of security and help reduce stress. Here are some tips:

- plan regular weekly activities, such as seeing friends and relatives or taking part in a club or hobby
- have regular mealtimes
- set and stick to bed times, particularly for younger children, as sleep is important for children's mental and physical wellbeing (NHS, 2020)
- establish a night time routine for younger children, such as reading a story before bed
- work with older children to create a routine that works for them – including homework, seeing friends, extra-curricular activities and time offline.

#### **PTA**


#### 1. PTA ceilidh


Not only did everyone have a lovely time, but we have raised around £1500 from the event which is amazing and means the school can put in place more plans for improvement.


### Life Skills at Nether Green

In our Life Skills lessons this half term the children have been learning about community, with a focus on what a community is and how to contribute towards being part of a community. We have been looking at community within the school, how we care for others and respecting differences.

Our upper Key stage pupils are encouraged to think about diversity and its importance within communities, alongside human rights and their relationships to shared responsibilities. During assembles and within lessons our school values of mutual respect, tolerance, rule of law and individual liberty have been discussed, explored and promoted. Our Life Skills Curriculum is planned and delivered to inspire our pupils to be active members of the community to which they belong.

Children carrying out an investigation on light in their Science lesson.




### Year 4










This week in Year 5, children have been practising the formal method of division and applying this knowledge into reasoning problems.


