As part of our computing curriculum, we are lucky enough to have Sheffield Girls High Outreach Programme to teach us all about programming robots. Each class will have three afternoons with them throughout the Spring term.

Project: What are mountains and where are they?

We will be considering the following questions-What are the UK's mountains and what are they like? How are mountains formed?

What are the features of mountains?

What is the climate like in the mountains and how can this be a hazard to people living and visiting?

How is climate change and human activity affecting the mountain environment?

We will also have a stand-alone science project on: Why is reproduction vital for all living things?' Within this project, we will be covering the anatomy of the male and female body and changes that happen to the body as we grow up.

In SPaG we will continue to revise all of the KS2 punctuation and grammar. In addition to this, we will be learning to use devices to build cohesion within a paragraph and ellipsis.

Every two weeks, the children will be given a new set of spellings to learn, based on specific spelling rules or pattern.

The children will have a dedicated reading lesson three days a week as well as daily reading for pleasure time. These sessions give the children the opportunity to fully develop a range of reading skills. Our class novel this half term is A different kind of freedom: A Romani Story by Richard O' Neill.

Maths

In our daily maths lessons this term we will be covering the following topics:
