Community

Arts Council

The purpose of the Arts Council at Nether Green Junior School is to give the children a greater opportunity to steer the direction of our Arts provision, engaging them and empowering them to help make decisions that will influence the activities on offer in our setting. They also play an important role in organising and maintaining art equipment and music resources.

Similarly to the School Council, two members from each class from Y₃ to Y₆, make up our Arts Council and help to represent and share the views of their classmates at meetings which take place 2-3 times each half term.

Our Arts Council elections for this academic year are about to take place. One of our previous members, Helenka (Y6) will be continuing on the Arts Council for another year as our pupil chair. The rest of our Arts Council will be brand new to their roles! Class teachers will be talking to the children about this opportunity over the next few days and giving them information about how to apply. We look forward to introducing our new Arts Council to you soon.

Music of the Half Term

Listening to music is fundamental to musical understanding. By learning to listen critically, our children will not only expand their musical horizons but also gain a deeper understanding of how music is constructed and the impact it can have on the listener.

Listening to a broad range of music also helps develop other areas of musical activity, including composing and performing. Therefore, each half term we focus on a 'music of the half term' which is explored through assemblies and further listening opportunities.

This half term we will be focussing on Country music, exploring a wide range of performers from Dolly Parton to Beyoncé!

We will look at the way country music often tells a story and will be linking this to thoughts about transition, as the children settle into their new classes.





Language of the Half Term - Ga

Each term we select a different language for the pupils to learn greetings and basic phrases in. We choose languages which represent our school community. At Nether Green, we feel it is important to give bilingual children the chance to demonstrate their language skills, as well as have opportunity to share details of their family's country and culture. Language of the Half-term also allows monolingual English speakers to encounter and learn to speak a variety of languages.

All teachers embrace the selected language of the half-term and actively encourage the children to say good morning, good afternoon and respond to simple yes/no questions in the given language.

The chosen language for this half-term is Ga.

Ga is one of about eighty languages spoken in Ghana, in and around the capital Accra, by the Ga people. There are also some speakers in Togo, Benin and Western Nigeria.


Spotlight on the Curriculum - Maths


White Rose Maths Scheme

Across school we continue to use the White Rose Maths Scheme, a fantastic resource that ensures parity across year groups and the school. The scheme allows the teachers to support all learners, whatever their mathematical ability. All the lessons are supported with interactive flip charts to model and support the learning objective of each lesson.


Across school in the autumn term the children will have already covered place value, addition and subtraction. In the weeks leading up to Christmas we will be covering multiplication and division. In Y5 and Y6 they will be doing work on fractions. This is alongside weekly Basic Skills sessions and Flashback Maths. Basic Skills sessions are a chance for children to consolidate on previous learning, practise formal methods and pick up on misconceptions. Flashback Maths is where they solidify their grasp of previous areas of maths covered, consistently improving their short and long term memory.

Here are some examples of work so far.










Formal methods and presentation

In maths the emphasis has not only been on mastering the intricacies of mathematical operations but also on refining their presentation skills. The importance of presentation is really helping the children especially when solving addition, subtraction, multiplication and division problems using formal methods.

Times tables

Times tables is key to supporting children in so many areas of maths. To encourage the children, we will be presenting weekly 'Times Table Rock Stars' certificates - keep an eye out for the winners in the newsletter.



Learning in Action

Year 3



Year 3 have been fascinated by our project 'How did life change for people between the Stone Age and Iron Age?'
We visited Creswell Crags this week where we were able to explore a cave that people lived in during the Ice Age.



We also learnt about the job of a palaeontologist and were able to put together the skeletons of prehistoric animals.









We learnt about what Stone Age people would have needed to survive and worked together to make shelters and hunt for bison.

Over the last two weeks, the Y4s have really enjoyed their learning. In life skills, we thought about the key question: 'Are all friends the same?' We created a tangled web to show how we are linked as a class. This was a great visual way to show how we have so many things in common with each other.



We have also enjoyed starting to learn about poetry. We created some performance poetry pieces by using techniques from the wonderful poet, Michael Rosen. The children were fantastic at this.







In Y5, we have started to use clay to make Viking brooches. It's been very exciting!



We have also been learning about Longboats and how big and narrow they are! Y₅JE all managed to fit into one though, so we can go and raid the nearest town!



Year 6 are really enjoying their project "How should we power our world?" They have carried out geography field work. We met Tony who talked to us about the war memorial and its importance.

We have been debating the issues raised on the field trip in class.







Integrated Resource


