Message from the Headteacher

It has certainly been a hot week, and things are always a bit harder when the temperature rises, but the children have coped incredibly well and shown great maturity in staying sensible and looking after themselves and each other. Despite the heat, there has been lots of energy and enthusiasm across the school.

We have appointed a new teacher, Miss Horsefield, who will be joining us in September. She is already included in our planning for the upcoming transition weeks, and we are really looking forward to welcoming her to our school community.

On Monday 30th June, we will be sending home a letter outlining class arrangements for the next academic year, including which teacher will be with each class and year group. Over the coming weeks, teachers will begin to build relationships with their new classes through informal opportunities, followed by formal transition days which we will let you know more about very soon.

Last week, our Year 6 children attended Crucial Crew where they learned about important life skills such as staying safe online, how to deal with peer pressure, and how to respond in emergencies. Our Year 3 children also had a brilliant time on their river walk, learning about rivers and the local environment as part of their curriculum. Also last week, we introduced our new language of the half term in assembly: Romanian. 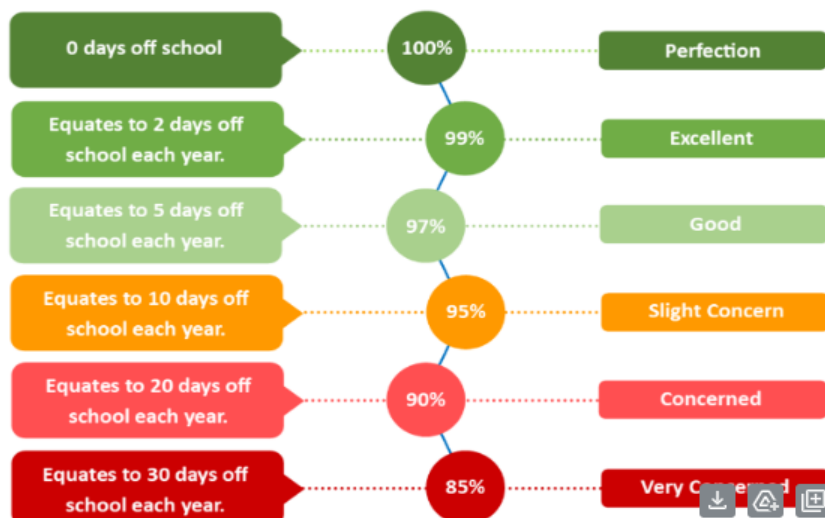
