Message from the Headteacher

A huge thank you to our PTA for their incredible work, especially in raising £2,100 during the Summer Festival. These funds will go towards exciting plans for a new climbing wall at the school, one of the projects we're working on in the coming months. We are so grateful for your support in helping make these projects a reality.

It was lovely to welcome Year 2 families at our Open Evening. It's always a pleasure to meet the new children and parents and carers joining our school.

We have also had the pleasure of supporting work experience students from local secondary schools this week. It's great to see these students engaging with our school community and gaining valuable experience.

Year 4 visited Endcliffe Park, searching for invertebrates in different microhabitats, linked to their science topic on ecosystems. They then had fun building their own microhabitats in groups.

Today, Year 5 are in Eyam as part of their curriculum work, connecting their studies to real-life history. We're so proud of their engagement and enthusiasm so far. A special thank you to all the parents who volunteered and made both trips possible.

In Year 6, the children had a great time making pizzas with Taylor Shaw. It was a fun and hands-on experience that gave them the chance to learn something new and creative.

On Thursday we had an assembly led by the Eco Ambassadors, where the children explained what should go in each of our bins and talked about the importance of recycling. One of the things they were keen to stress is that sweet wrappers, crisp packets and cereal bar wrappers cannot go in the recycling bins at our school. Therefore, for both health reasons and environmental reasons, the Eco team reminded pupils that they should try to choose fruit or vegetables as a snack instead.

The Eco Ambassadors then had a visit from Georgina who works for Modeshift Stars, part of PWLC Projects. The Eco Ambassadors learned all about how dangerous air pollution can be and have made air pollution catchers, which you might see by the gate. They are keen to encourage adults in our community to park away from the school gates to reduce air pollution for our school and wider area, as well as ensuring children's safety.

On this topic, we ask for your continued cooperation in keeping our roads safe around the school. Parking on double yellow lines or near junctions is extremely dangerous for pedestrians, including our children. Please help us ensure their safety by adhering to parking regulations and thinking more about our local community.




Attendance
